

# MORE THINGS TO DO...

**Camping and caravanning** – Milton is an RV friendly town which provides dumping as well as toilet and showering facilities for a token fee.

There are also five recreational parks in the area with a broad range of camping, caravanning and accommodation options.



## Golf

Nearby Mollymook Golf Club boasts two magnificent golf courses and two modern clubhouses. The Championship Hilltop course is 18 holes of bushland beauty, situated so that you can still hear the waves rolling in on the pristine Mollymook Beach. Hilltop is affectionately known as “**The Ultimate Challenge**” and was rated the No. 97 golf course in the March 2008 edition of The Australian Golf Digest.

## Sunday afternoon Jazz



On the first Sunday of every month (except New Years Day), enjoy a relaxing afternoon of mellow jazz in the beautiful setting of Cupitt’s Winery, just ten minutes from Milton on Washburton Road, Ulladulla.

### **Milton Theatre**

The Milton Theatre is an intimate 200 seat theatre which was built in 1927 as a School of Arts. It has played a significant role in Milton community life ever since. Initially a picture theatre and venue for dance and other community events, from 1976 to 1993 this historic building was used solely as a movie theatre before extensive renovations were carried out in 1997 and the building given over to live theatre, community performances and a recording studio.

### **Arts and Craft galleries**

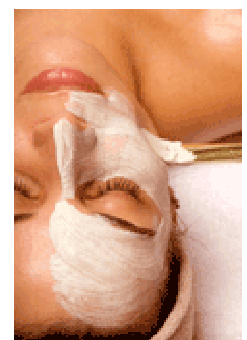
Milton boasts a number galleries within the town and The Milton Cultural Centre incorporates the Millhouse Art Society, where over 100 paintings by local artists are displayed; Nulladolla Pottery, presenting quality ceramics and pottery ; Abstract Artform, featuring abstract artworks by local artist Maz Raynsford; and Milton Timber Gallery where one can buy quality hand made solid wooden furniture produced from Australian timbers.



### **Day Spas**

## Enjoy the lakes and beaches



Mollymook Beach is patrolled throughout the summer, making it ideal for swimming or surfing. Surfing lessons are available at Mollymook or Narrawallee Beach. Burrill Lake is popular for Windsurfing and leisurely fishing from purpose-built platforms that line the lake. The Bogey Hole is a naturally protected swimming and snorkelling area that can be found around the south headland of Mollymook Beach. It is an ideal swimming spot for young children, as is the Narrawallee inlet.

Milton village is just a few kilometres from some of the world's most beautiful white sand beaches, coastal lakes, inlets and rivers.



## Fishing charters from Ulladulla Harbour

Ulladulla Fishing Charters operates charters for Deep Sea and Reef fishing, departing from Ulladulla harbour and fishing the coast east, north and south of the port.

Game fishing runs from November to June, Sport fishing from December to June and Reef fishing from July to November.

Charters are also available for whale watching.
